Understanding the CELPIP Speaking Test

Test Format and Structure

The CELPIP Speaking Test is a 15-20 minute computer-based test that assesses your ability to communicate effectively in a variety of everyday situations. It consists of eight tasks, each with its own preparation and speaking time.

Here's a quick overview of the eight tasks:

- **Task 1:** Giving Advice
- **Task 2:** Talking about a Personal Experience
- **Task 3:** Describing a Scene
- **Task 4:** Making Predictions
- **Task 5:** Comparing and Persuading
- **Task 6:** Dealing with a Difficult Situation
- **Task 7:** Expressing Opinions
- **Task 8:** Describing an Unusual Situation

Scoring Criteria

Your performance on the CELPIP Speaking Test is evaluated based on four key criteria:

- **Content/Coherence:** How well you understand the prompt and how clearly you express your ideas.
- **Vocabulary:** The range and accuracy of your vocabulary.
- **Grammar & Sentence Structure:** Your ability to use a variety of grammatical structures accurately.
- **Pronunciation:** Your clarity, intonation, and rhythm.

A CELPIP Level 9 or higher is often considered a strong score for Canadian immigration purposes.

Part 2

Acing the Speaking Tasks

Giving Advice

The Task: In this task, you will be presented with a situation where a friend or family member is asking for advice. You'll have 30 seconds to prepare and 60 seconds to speak.

A 3-Step Structure for Success:

1. **Acknowledge the Situation:**
Start by showing that you understand the person's problem.
2. **Give Two Pieces of Advice:** Offer two distinct suggestions and explain why they are helpful.
3. **Conclude with Encouragement:**
End your response on a positive and supportive note.

Sample Question:

"My friend wants to get fit, but she doesn't know where to start. What advice can I give her?"



 **Try to time yourself and record your answer.**

Sample Answer:

"Hi [Friend's Name], I understand you're looking for some advice on how to help your friend get fit. I have a couple of suggestions that might help. First, I would suggest that she starts by finding an activity she enjoys. It could be anything from dancing to hiking or swimming. If she enjoys it, she's more likely to stick with it. Second, you could suggest that she sets realistic goals. Instead of aiming for a marathon right away, she could start with a 30-minute walk every day. As for my final piece of advice, just be there to support her and cheer her on. I'm sure she'll be running that marathon in no time!"

Expert Tips:

- Use transition words (e.g., "first," "second," "finally").
- Speak confidently and at a natural pace.
- Avoid long pauses.
- Keep your sentences clear and logical.



Part 2 (cont'd)

The 3 Toughest Tasks

According to E2Language students, the three most challenging tasks are 6, 7, and 8. Here's how to tackle them:

Task 6: Dealing with a Difficult Situation

This task requires you to resolve a conflict or make a complaint, balancing assertiveness with politeness.

Structured Approach:

1. State the purpose of your call/conversation.
2. Explain the problem clearly and concisely.
3. Propose a solution or two.
4. Conclude politely.

Task 7: Expressing Opinions

In this task, you'll be asked to give your opinion on a topic. The key is to provide a clear and well-supported argument.

Structured Approach:

State your opinion clearly. Provide two reasons to support your opinion. Give a real-life example to illustrate one of your reasons. Conclude by summarizing your opinion.



The 3 Toughest Tasks (cont'd)

Task 8: Describing an Unusual Situation

This task requires you to describe a strange or unusual picture and leave a message for someone explaining the situation.

Structured Approach:

1. Start by addressing the person you are calling.
2. Explain where you are and what you are seeing.
3. Describe the unusual situation in detail.
4. End the message with a call to action or a suggestion.
